Roger E. Bechdolt, 93, formerly of Celina, passed away at Otterbein, St. Marys, on December 11, 2019 at 8:30 pm. He was born on December 19, 1925 in Highland Park, Michigan, to Jesse and Etha (Deitsch) Bechdolt; both preceded him in death. He married his truelove Evelyn Stelzer on April 21, 1951. She passed away in November, 2015.

He was dedicated to, and delighted in, his many family members. When they closed the store in 1960 after some 24 years in business, Roger sold mutual funds and then went to a career at the First National Bank, where he worked for many years. Later, he sold real estate before retiring for travel, time with family and winters in Melbourne Beach, Florida.

Roger was a lifelong member of St. John's Lutheran Church. He was a member of several service clubs, notably Sertoma, the Masonic Lodge and the Elks. He was a loving and dedicated husband, father, brother, uncle, great uncle and great-great uncle. He loved

spending time with family and friends, particularly days spent boating on the lake and or playing cards. For many years, Roger enjoyed spending winters in Florida in a beautiful spot between the Indian River and the Atlantic Ocean, with his friends and beloved wife, Evelyn. We will miss his cheerful optimism, kind nature and his sweet smile.
